## 3. SEA Screening Report

The Council has considered the likely significance of effects on the environment of the 'Supplementary Guidance – Moffat Conservation Area Character Appraisal and Management Plan' as set out in the following summary. Table 1 below has a fuller explanation of how these conclusions have been reached.

# **Summary of Environmental Effects**

The Supplementary Guidance will not have any significant environmental effects because it is an assessment of the existing buildings and features within and adjoining the Moffat Conservation Area. The document will provide information for decision makers, the public and other stakeholders regarding the special character, qualities, threats, opportunities and constraints within the area considered. The Moffat Conservation Area Character Appraisal and Management Plan defines the special historic and architectural character within the area surveyed and will serve as a management tool for review of the conservation area boundary; making decisions and identifying opportunities for potential further action by the local planning authority and others who may wish to prepare enhancement schemes.

No	The SG 'Moffat Conservation Area Character Appraisal and Management Plan' does not set a framework for actions but reviews the boundary of the conservation area and provides information on the merits of, constraints and threats to the area which is designated for its special character. It sets out key characteristics and how they

		should be managed. It also identifies opportunities for long-term preservation and enhancement of the area.

No	The SG provides background guidance to policy within the adopted Local Development Plan. It is not intended that it should directly influence other programmes or strategies other than to support applications for funding where that funding will preserve or enhance the character of the conservation area.
1(c) Is the PPS relevant to the integration of environmental considerations, in particular with a view to promoting sustainable development?	No	The SG will provide supportive guidance to help integrate environmental considerations and promote sustainable development, such as encouraging repair, long term maintenance and climate change adaptations to traditionally constructed buildings within the conservation area.
1(d) What are the environmental problems that are relevant to the PPS?	No	The appraisal identifies some under-use and poor building condition within the conservation area but does not introduce new policy considerations.  Consequently, no environmental issues are raised.
1(e) Will the PPS be relevant to the implementation of Community Legislation on the environment? (e.g., PPS linked to waste management or water protection)	No	The appraisal does not introduce new policy considerations and does not make any reference to this issue. If applicable, this would be considered in the assessment of individual planning applications.
2(a) Will the environmental effects be significant when consideration is given to their probability, duration, frequency and reversibility?	No	There are no significant environmental effects identified.

2(b) Will the environmental effects be cumulative in nature? (Consider the impact of other PPS's as well as local conditions)	No	There are no significant environmental effects identified. However, it is intended that the document will encourage incremental improvements through better decision making to produce modest cumulative enhancement to the character of the conservation area.
2(c) Will the environmental effects be trans-boundary in nature? (i.e., environmental effects on other Local Authorities or EU Member states)	No	There are no significant effects identified. The location of Moffat Conservation Area is wholly within Dumfries and Galloway Council's administrative region.
2(d) Will the environmental effects be significant when consideration is given to the potential risks to human health? (e.g., contribution to medical conditions or the possibility of accidents)	No	There are no significant effects identified.

OR iii) Intensive land use?	No	The supplementary guidance is intended to consolidate and preserve the cultural heritage of the very localised conservation area. There will be no significant change to cultural heritage. The appraisal seeks to control development and manage existing historic structures and spaces to ensure the protection of the character of the area.

2(g) Will the PPS have a significant environmental effect on areas or landscapes which have a recognised national, Community or international protection status? No

Moffat Conservation Area lies within the Moffat Hills Regional Scenic Area and has three Category A Listed Buildings. 'Auldton Mote' Scheduled Monument lies 190m east of the conservation area.

The CACAMP is an assembly of information and highlights the importance, and sensitivity, of the existing landscape, built heritage and archaeology to ensure that they will be preserved or enhanced by any future actions which take place within the Moffat Conservation Area. It does not itself propose any actions that would impact on the designations and any development that comes forward in the future as separate proposals will be scrutinised through the planning system.

The areas proposed for inclusion within the conservation area and the area proposed for removal from the conservation area will be subject to formal consultation.

The document will enable the Council to fulfil its statutory duties to preserve and enhance the character of Moffat Conservation Area and help to raise awareness of the special characteristics and sensitivity of the area.

Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005 Supplementary Guidance: Moffat Conservation Area Character Appraisal and Management Plan - Screening Report

Thank you for your Screening Report consultation which SEPA received via the Scottish Government SEA Gateway on 07 March 2019.

In accordance with Section 9(3) of the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005 we have considered your screening report using the criteria set out in Schedule 2 for determining the likely significance of effects on the environment. Having reviewed the Screening Report, we consider that in respect of our main areas of interest (air, water, soil, human health, material assets (of which we have a specific interest in waste) and climatic factors) the Moffat Conservation Area Character Appraisal and Management Plan Supplementary Guidance is unlikely to have significant environmental effects. Although we are of the view that significant environmental effects are not likely, it is for the Dumfries and Galloway Council as Responsible Authority to make a formal determination taking into account the consultation responses received.

If it is formally determined that SEA *is* required, you will be aware that the next stage requires the Responsible Authority to consult the Consultation Authorities on the proposed scope and level of detail to be included within the Environmental Report. This can be undertaken through preparation of a concise Scoping Report. We would encourage you to use the scoping process to focus the assessment on those SEA issues upon which there are likely to be significant environmental effects, to outline the baseline information you consider as most relevant and explain your proposed method of assessment. To assist with this process we have produced <u>SEA topic guidance</u> for those issues which fall within our remit. Further information on scoping can be found in the <u>Scottish Government SEA Guidance</u> (sections 3.4 to 3.8 in particular).

We are committed to providing early and focused advice and supporting continuous engagement and therefore if it is determined that SEA is required we would welcome the opportunity to meet with you and discuss these issues prior to the formal consultation.

#### **Screening Report**

Thank you for your consultation which we received on 05 March 2019 about the above screening report. We have reviewed the screening report in our role as a Consultation Authority under the above Act, in accordance with the requirements of Section 9(3). In doing so we have used the criteria set out in Schedule 2 for determining the likely significance of the effects on the environment. Please note that our view is based on main area of interest for the historic environment.

We understand from the screening report that the Moffat Conservation Area Character Appraisal and Management Plan is intended to support the implementation of policy HE2 of the adopted Dumfries and Galloway Local Development Plan (2014). It will define and appraise features and the pattern of built development that contribute to the special character of the Moffat Conservation Area. It will also establish the optimum ways of preserving and enhancing the distinctive character of the Conservation Area.

Given that the Local Development Plan has already been subject to a full SEA, it is considered that the guidance will in itself have minimal environmental effects. On the basis of the information provided, we agree that the Moffat Conservation Area Character Appraisal and Management Plan is unlikely to have significant effects on the historic environment.

However, as you will be aware, it is the responsibility of Dumfries and Galloway Council as the Responsible Authority to determine whether the guidance requires an environmental assessment and to inform the Consultation Authorities accordingly.
