
FACULTY OF ARTS & CREATIVITY

Mrs Adair is the longest-standing member of the Art & Design team, and possibly taught your parents! She is also a tutor (register teacher)


Her interests are in painting and graphic design. Other things she is involved in currently at Dumfries Academy include our LGBT Charter and promoting creativity across the curriculum

Music

In school she directs and stagemanages school shows and performances, and runs an afterschool dance club



What to expect in S1 courses

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
This year may continue to be different from usual, and the lessons will be delivered in different ways.

We will do everything we can to make sure you all feel safe, included and supported so you can make good progress

Ours are **practical subjects**. This means there is a lot of individual teaching and learning which happens as you **do** things – like painting, playing an instrument or acting

We will teach you lots of new skills and give you opportunities for new experiences

ART & DESIGN



The Art & Design course normally covers a range of skills, techniques and abilities

- Expressive Art (observational drawing, painting, sculpture, printmaking; using a variety of materials)
- Design (including 3D, textiles, graphic design incorporating use of computers; following the design process)
 - Critical Thinking (talking/writing about your work and the work of others; learning to analyse and evaluate)

Our courses are created to give pupils confidence, problem solving skills and creative ability

The Creative Industries continues to be the fastest growing economic sector in Scotland with approximately 1 in 11 jobs in Scotland in this area. We are seeing more roles in games, fashion, architecture, illustration, media and all areas of design

As well as careers the visual arts help young people communicate ideas and emotions. Art and Design gives us a deeper understanding of ourselves and our world. Artists enrich our cultural lives and help us understand the world we live in



MUSIC



Learners will develop instrumental and vocal skills and through these activities they will explore musical concepts. They will develop their confidence by using their skills to create and perform music, including through use of IT. Conceptual knowledge will be gained through practical performances and listening to a variety of musical styles

Music pupils are encouraged to fulfil their potential through creating and participating. They will develop skills and knowledge in performance, creating, listening and understanding music. At this time especially, listening to and playing music enriches our lives and also benefits our well-being and helps us express ourselves



When life is back to normal, pupils can opt into the regional band, choir or orchestra. They can enter the local Burns Competition, Music Festival and National Competitions if they wish to do so

Pupils are encouraged to access the Regional Instrumental Service for lessons on orchestral instruments as well as guitar and tuned percussion when this service resumes

In the Creative Industries we are seeing many career opportunities for example in sound recording, sound engineering, film and TV and in music for the games industry


DRAMA



The S1 Drama course is a creative course designed to expand pupils' communication and co-operation skills. Pupils will learn to develop their knowledge of drama terminology and the creative process

In S1 we usually focus on developing the ability to work as part of a team to create a finished product, though this might be different this year. Pupils will learn skills such as mime, and will also learn how to develop their use of voice and movement to develop a character

We hope this will result in an end of year performance, where pupils will have the opportunity to create their own piece of Drama using the skills learned throughout the year



In addition we watch performances to build skills in analysis and evaluation based on developing an understanding of acting and directing as well as the design and technical aspects of theatre and film

When life returns to normal there will be opportunities to take part in shows and performances

In the Creative Industries there are all sorts of opportunities and careers in film, TV and theatre from acting and voice acting, writing and directing, to sound and lighting, make-up and costume

We look forward to meeting you all and welcoming you to our classrooms

Let's work together to make this different approach to transition a success – this is a creative challenge, and creative challenges are what we are good at

Meanwhile, we look forward to welcoming you to Dumfries Academy when you join us in S1!
