
What happens to your food waste...



Food waste is collected from the kerbside and loaded into the vehicle



This produces methane which can be used to generate energy



It is unloaded at the processing plant where it is shredded and heat treated in a sealed tank using a process called anaerobic digestion



and helps to produce agricultural fertilisers too

Why should I recycle food waste?

Using this service means food waste can be turned into valuable resources such as agricultural fertilisers and energy. This will allow Dumfries and Galloway to help Scotland meet its ambitious target of recycling 70% of all waste by 2025, as well supporting the council's mission to achieve net zero carbon status by 2025.

Do I have enough food waste to warrant using this service?

Everyone has food waste - whether it's unavoidable food waste such as tea bags, bones, eggshells or leftovers, even small amounts make a difference when they are recycled. Even if you think you don't produce much food waste why not give the new service a try - you might be surprised at how quickly your caddy fills up!

Is it not better to reduce food waste than recycle it?

It is always better to reduce food waste, however everyone has unavoidable food waste.

When will my kerbside caddy be emptied?

We will empty your kerbside caddy **every week** - check the sticker on the lid to find out which day of the week this will be. Please note this may be different from your usual bin collection day.

How to use your new food waste recycling service





Lost your kitchen or kerbside food caddy?

Food waste recycling is a clean and easy way to get rid of your unavoidable food waste. We all have it, whether it's tea bags, egg shells or banana skins, this service can be used for it all, even out of date food and bones.

The two-caddy system

Compact 5 litre kitchen caddy

Compact 5 litre kitchen caddy

- You can empty your kitchen caddy as often as necessary.
- Your caddy can be stored anywhere including in a cupboard or outside.
- Keep your caddies clean and avoid spillages by only filling the liner 3/4 full before tying.
- Give your caddy a quick rinse after emptying to keep it clean.
- Keep your indoor caddy clean and fresh by using new liners

Need more liners?

Simply tie an unused liner to the handle of your kerbside caddy on collection day. Once it's been emptied we will leave a new roll of liners inside free of charge!



Un-bagged food should not be placed in the kerbside caddy - please put it in a liner first.

How to use your caddies...








2 Transfer any cooked or uncooked food waste to the caddy.







Place the full liner into your **kerbside** caddy (no un-bagged food).
