We do this through place-based work and embedded arts practice, we will support creative conversation, enterprise and inclusion. We will bring together diverse communities to promote and develop wellbeing and sustainable local futures.

A. What do you want the asset for?

The Stove building is a public arts centre in the heart of Dumfries town centre. It is run by a membership (650) of local artists, groups and individuals, The Stove Network produce a programme of creative events, exhibitions and workshops designed to support people to actively participate and have a voice in the future of their area.

B. What benefits will this bring to the local community?

The Stove Network (TSN) is a community anchor organisation for Dumfries and Galloway (D+G), a development trust based in the heart of Dumfries & the coordinating hub for D&G's Creative Placemaking Network (What We Do Now [WWDN]). Other WWDN hubs are in Sanquhar, Stranraer, Langholm, Castle Douglas & NW Dumfries. TSN functions as a social enterprise, has c.650 members & operates through a board annually elected by our membership. Our operations range from running a community café & activity programme co-delivered with our community to establishing a regional Creative Placemaking Network with other hubs & regional organisations. We currently provide regular employment for 43 people within our communities. Founded in 2011, TSN works in vulnerable communities & uses arts & cultural activity to bring together local people to develop positive place- based visions & plans for equality & justice. We co-deliver new initiatives that promote & develop wellbeing & sustainable local futures. Our work seeks to engage the widest possible range of people on issues relevant to their lives in ways that can make a lasting difference. TSN is a bridge between communities, enterprises, organisations & funders – supporting under-represented groups to be heard in decision making processes. We deliver a range of activities from large-scale community events/festivals to regular groups/workshops & partnership projects delivered with communities. Typically, projects are developed over long periods of time and co-produced with service users to meet their needs. Project impacts range

from personal/professional growth in confidence/skills, starting new social enterprises/initiatives or new community groups to regeneration/environmental improvement projects. Our Creative Placemaking methodology centres learning & skills development at all levels, including training opportunities within project teams, particularly for young people & those experiencing disadvantage and inequality. We build & sustain networks locally, regionally, nationally, & increasingly internationally sharing best practice.

In 2021-22 we have offered 94 opportunities for the local creative community valued at £250,000 (up from £141,000 in 2020-21).
